

1	Hon'ble Mr. Justice A.D.Koshal	 <p>Mr. Justice A.D. Koshal, Born at Ahmedgarh situated in the erstwhile Malerkotla State (now in Sangrur district of Punjab State) on the 7th March, 1917. Had his schooling in the S.D.S.E. High School, Patiala and the Public High School, Ahmedgarh from where he passed the Matriculation examination in 1930. Passed the F.Sc. (Non-Medical) examination from the Forman Christian College. Lahore and obtained his Arts Degree two years later from the Government College, Ludhiana. Graduated in Law from the Law College, Lahore in the year 1936. The same year he started practice as a Pleader at Ludhiana. In 1939 he became an Advocate of the Malerkotla High Court wherein he practised till 1945 in which year he resumed his practice at Ludhiana. Enrolled as an Advocate of the Punjab High Court in 1948 and practised as such at Ludhiana till the Ist of February, 1960. appointed Additional District & Sessions Judge, Ferozepur on the 2nd of February, 1960. Transferred as District and Sessions Judge, Amritsar in which capacity he worked from 13th March, 1961 to the 9th of July, 1966. Served as Legal Remembrancer and Secretary to Government, Law Department in Punjab from 10th July, 1966 to 31st October, 1966 and in Haryana from Ist November 1966 to 18th June, 1967, when he was appointed Registrar of the High Court of Punjab & Haryana which post he held till the 28th May, 1968, when he was elevated to the bench. 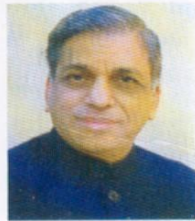

On his retransfer to Chandigarh, assumed charge of the office of Judge of the High Court of Punjab and Haryana of the 8th of August, 1977. Promoted as Chief Justice of that Court with effect from 1st November, 1977 and as a Judge of the Supreme Court of India on 17th July, 1978. Retired on 6th March, 1982.</p>		
2	<p>Hon'ble Mr. Justice Rabindranath Pyne</p>	 <p>Justice Rabindra Nath Pyne, B.A., (Hons.), Barrister-at-law - Born on 28th September, 1928. Educated at Hindu School and Presidency College, Calcutta. Enrolled Advocate, Calcutta High Court in May, 1954. Practised on the Original Side dealing with Commercial Company, Arbitration, Constitutional, Customs and Central Excise matters. Was also in the panel of Central Government Advocates. appointed Additional Judge, Calcutta High Court from 6th March, 1974. Appointed permanent Judge on 16.4.1975. 3	Hon'ble Mr. Justice S.A. Hakeem	 <p>Hon'ble Mr. Justice S.A. Hakeem: A graduate from St Joseph's college and an alumnus of Govt Law College Mr Justice S A Hakeem commenced his legal practice in 1954, handling mainly writ petitions and civil cases in the High Court and Subordinate Courts in Bangalore City. Appointed as Central Govt Standing Counsel for Central Govt in 1975, continued till his elevation to the bench in 1983, became an Acting Chief Justice in 1995 and confirmed as Chief Justice of Karnataka in 1996. Soon after retirement was appointed Lokayukta in 1996. He won many laurels as an administrator with vision and proficiency, was a member of the Karnataka Legal Aid Board and headed many Govt and Non Govt institutions and has rendered memorable services. Scholarly and sociable Justice Hakeem was known for his amiability in speedy disposal of cases.</p>	2-6-1996	1-6-2001
4	Hon'ble Mr. Justice N.Venkatachala	 <p>Mr. Justice Nanje Gowda Venkatachala, B.Sc., B.L., Born on 3rd July, 1930 in Mittur village in Mulabagal Taluk in Kolar District in a respectable agriculturist's family. Had primary and middle school education at Mulabagal, High School education at Kolar, College education at Bangalore. Obtained B.Sc. degree and B.L. degree from Mysore University. Enrolled as an Advocate in the then High Court of Mysore (now Karnataka) on 16th November, 1955. Had built up good practice in the High Court and its subordinate courts at Bangalore in civil, criminal and constitutional matters. Was a part-time Reader in Mercantile Law from 1958 to 1970. Was a Legal Adviser to the University of Agricultural Sciences, Hebbal from 1963 to 1973 and to the Bangalore University from 1970 to 1973. Was High Court Govt. 		Advocate from 1973 to 1977. Appointed as Additional Judge, Karnataka High Court from 28th November, 1977. Appointed Permanent Judge from 8th September, 1978. Functioned as Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Tribunal under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967 during the year 1990. Appointed as the Acting Chief Justice, Karnataka High Court in May, 1992. Sworn-in as Judge of the Supreme Court of India on 1st July, 1992. Retired on 2.7.1995.		
5	Hon'ble Mr. Justice N.Santosh Hegde	 <p>Mr. Justice N. Santosh Hegde was born on June 16, 1940. He graduated in law in 1965 and after completing apprenticeship training was enrolled as an Advocate in January, 1966 and designated as senior Advocate in May, 1984. He was appointed as the Advocate General for the State of Karnataka in February, 1984 and held that position till August, 1988. He worked as Additional Solicitor General of the Union of India from December, 1989 to November, 1990. He was appointed as the Solicitor General of India on April 25, 1998. Hon'ble Justice Shri Shivaraj V. Patil S-O Shri.Virupanna Patil, was born on 12th January, 1940. Joined Bar at Gulbarga, on 25.7.1962. He became Honorary Principal of Sait Shankarlal Lahoti Law College of HKE Society,



Gulbarga of which he was a student of the first batch. Wrote a small book on the life of the great saint "Shree Sharanabasaveswara" Gulbarga. He shifted to Bengaluru in February, 1979 to exclusively practice in the High Court of Karnataka. He was elevated as Judge, High Court of Karnataka at Bengaluru on 29.3.1990. Transferred to High Court of Madras on 29.4.1994 and was acting Chief Justice there from 29.12.1998 till 19.1.1999. He assumed office of Chief Justice of High Court of Rajasthan on 22.1.1999. Elevated as Judge of the Supreme Court of India on 15.3.2000. He was a Member of the National Human Rights Commission of India between 3rd February, 2005 to February 2008.

Served as Lokayukta of Karnataka between the period from 3.8.2011 to 20.9.2011. During this period besides other works, meetings were held with the Enquiry Officers, Police Officers and other officials of Lokayukta to take various steps and measures to serve the institution of Lokayukta effectively and meaningfully.

		<p>In regard to cases pertaining to corruption, it was impressed that there was a need for expeditious and scientific investigations, effective prosecution and speedy trial to serve the purpose and to send effective message to all the concerned. Decision was also taken to hold camp sittings at District headquarters to enable people of the area to file complaints if any and to dispose of pending complaints on the spot expeditiously and effectively in the presence of concerned local Officers. Accordingly camp sittings were held at Gulbarga, Yadgiri and Raichur for the first time. The experience of camp sittings was good and positive results were achieved. It was also considered that some technique was to be developed with the help of Technology to track movement of pending files in various public-Government offices to find out the reasons for the delay at different levels and to hold the concerned officials responsible. This would besides cutting the delay would have saved the people coming from distant places by spending time and money and reducing the possibility of corruption. It was also decided to request the Government to install CCTV Cameras in the offices of the Sub• Registrars and such other offices and also arrange for registration of the documents online with the idea that it will help the people and reduce the corruption.</p>

7	Hon'ble Justice Dr. Y. Bhaskar Rao	 <p>Hon'ble Sri Justice Y. Bhaskar Rao was born on 26.6.1938 at Kalva Srirampur Village in Karimnagar District, Andhra Pradesh. He obtained the Bachelor of Law Degree from the Osmania University. Enrolled as an Advocate in the year 1964, practised with late Justice Sri Vemuganti Madhava Rao. Appointed as permanent Judge of High Court of Andhra Pradesh on 11.7.1986. Transferred to Karnataka High court, Bangalore as Judge, later His Lordship became Chief Justice of Karnataka High Court, Bangalore on 09.03.1999 and retired on 26.06.2000. □ Elevated as a permanent Judge of Karnataka High Court on 18th December 1995 and served till his retirement on 2nd May 2006.

□ He was nominated by the then Chief Justice of High Court of Karnataka as president of the Karnataka Judicial Academy, which was being managed by five judges of which four other judges were the Governors on 7th August 1999 and continued to serve in that position till June 2002. The Karnataka Judicial Academy has the reputation of being one of the best Judicial Academy, established for training members of the District Judiciary in the Country.

- Invited by the British High Commission to visit UK to study their Criminal Justice System in the year 1999. At UK he had the occasion to visit the Courts, Juvenile Jails and Warwick University as a part of the programme.
- Functioned as the chairman of the High Court Legal Services Committee from 01-07-2002 to 07-10-2004.
- Appointed as Executive Chairman of the Karnataka State Legal Services Authority on 07-10-2004 and continued in that position till his retirement on 2nd May 2006.
- During his Executive Chairmanship of Karnataka Legal Services Authority, two important programmes were conceived:-
- Student Legal Aid and Literacy Clubs were established and the same was inaugurated by his Excellency Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam, President of India. and
- A Student Advocacy Programme linking institutions of Learning - SAPLING was launched and the project COMBAT was launched and it was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Mr. Justice K G. Balakrishnan, Judge, Supreme Court of India.
- Retired as a permanent Judge of the Hon'ble High Court of Karnataka on 02-05-2006. Post retirement
- Started practicing before the Supreme Court of India during 1st week of July 2006 and since then he was practicing before the Supreme Court of India and appearing before the High Court of Delhi and few other High Courts till he was appointed as Lokayukta.
