ORDER

In 'Samyuktha Karnataka daily' dated 30.05.2022, a news item with the heading "ಇದ್ದೂ ಇಲ್ಲದಂತಾದ ಸಿ.ಅ. ಸ್ಟ್ರಾನ್ ಯಂತ್ರಗಳು" has been published. Instead of repeating the news item, it is useful to extract the same, which reads as hereunder:

" ಸಿ.ಟ. ಸ್ಟ್ರ್ಯಾನ್ ಯಂತ್ರ ಖರೀವಿಸಿ ಸುಮಾರು ಒಂದೂವರೆ ತಿಂಗಳು ಕಳೆದರೂ ಮೂರು ತಾಲ್ಲೂಕು ಆಸ್ಪತ್ರೆಗಳು ಮತ್ತು ಸರ್ಕಾರಿ ಜಲ್ಲಾಸ್ಪತ್ರೆಗಳಲ್ಲ ಈವರೆವಿಗೂ ಅನುಷ್ಠಾನ ಭಾಗ್ಯ ಕಂಡಿಲ್ಲ.

ವೈದ್ಯಕೀಯ ಶಿಕ್ಷಣ ಇಲಾಖೆಯು ಕಲ್ಯಾಣ ಕರ್ನಾಟಕ ಜಲ್ಲೆಯ ಅನುದಾನದ ඏඍ ಪ್ರದೇಶಾಭವೃದ್ಧಿ ಮಂಡಆಯ ಗಂಗಾವತಿ, ಯಲಬುರ್ಗಾ, ಕುಷ್ಟಗಿ ತಾಲ್ಲೂಕು ಆರೋಗ್ಯ ಕೇಂದ್ರ ಕೊಸ್ಪಳದ ಸರ್ಕಾರಿ ಜಲ್ಲಾಸ್ಪತ್ರೆಗೆ లి.69. ಸ್ಟ್ರ್ಯಾನ್ ಮತ್ತು ಯಂತ್ರಗಳನ್ನು ಖಲೀದಿಸಿ, ಕಳುಹಿಸಿದೆ. ಪ್ರತಿ ಸಿ.ಟ. ಯಂತ್ರಕ್ಕೆ ರೂ.3 ಕೋಣ ವ್ಯಯಸಲಾಗಿದ್ದು, ಒಟ್ಟು ರೂ.12 ಕೋಣ ಖರ್ಚು ಮಾಡಲಾಗಿದೆ. ಆದರೆ, ಈವರೆಗೂ ಸಿ.ಟ. ಯಂತ್ರಗಳು ಅನುಷ್ಣಾನಗೊಳ್ಳುತ್ತಿಲ್ಲ. ಇತ್ತೀಚೆಗೆ ನಡೆದ ತ್ರೈಮಾನಿಕ ಪ್ರಗತಿ ಪರಿಶೀಲನಾ ಸಭೆಯಲ್ಲ ಸಂಸದ ಸಂಗಣ್ಣ ಕರಡಿ, ಜಿಲ್ಲಾ

ಉಸ್ಸುವಾಲಿ ಸಚಿವ ಆನಂದ್, ಿಂಗ್, ಸಚಿವ ಹಾಲಪ್ಪ ಆಚಾರ್, ರಾಘವೇಂದ್ರ ಶಾಸಕರಾದ ಹಿಬ್ಯಾ ಆ್ ಮತ್ತು ಅಮರೇಗೌಡ ಬಯ್ಯಾಸುರ ಸೇಲಿದಂತೆ ಎಲ್ಲ ಜನಪ್ರತಿನಿಧಿಗಳೂ ಸಿ.ಚಿ. ಸ್ಟ್ರ್ಯಾನ್ ಯಂತ್ರ ಖಲೀಬಿಸಿ \$ ಖನಗಳು ಕಳೆದರೂ ಭನ್ನೂ ಅನುಷ್ಠಾನಗೊಳಸಿಲ್ಲ. ಭದಲಿಂದ ಸಾರ್ವಜನಿಕಲಿಗೆ ತೊಂದರೆ ಆಗುತ್ತಿದೆ ಎಂದು ಜಲ್ಲಾ ಆರೋಗ್ಯಾಭಿಕಾರಿಗಳನ್ನು ತರಾಬೆಗೆ ತೆಗೆದುಕೊಂಡರು. ಆದರೂ ಕೂಡ ಪಲ್ಲ್ಯೂತಿ ಸುಧಾರಣೆ ಕಂಡುಬಂದಿಲ್ಲ.

संकारि ಜಲ್ಲಾಸ್ಪತ್ರೆ ಮತ್ತು ತಾಲ್ಲೂಕು ಆರೋಗ್ಯ ಕೇಂದ್ರಗಳಗೆ ಬಂದ ರೋಗಿಗಳು ಖಾಸಗಿ ಸಿ.ಟ. ಸ್ಟ್ಯಾನ್ ಕೇಂದ್ರಗಳಗೆ ಹೋಗಿ ಪರೀಕ್ಷೆ ಮಾಡಿಸಬೇಕಾಗಿದೆ. ಇದರಿಂದಾಗಿ ಸರ್ಕಾರಿ ಆಸ್ಪತ್ರೆಗಳಲ್ಲ ಚಿಕಿತ್ಸೆ ಪಡೆಯುವ ರೋಗಿಗಳು ಬಹಳಷ್ಟು ಹಣ ಖರ್ಚು ಮಾಡುತ್ತಿದ್ದಾರೆ. ಅಲ್ಲದೇ ಸಮಯವೂ ವ್ಯರ್ಥವಾಗುತ್ತಿದೆ.

ಸಿವಿಲ್ ಕೆಲಸ ನಡೆಯುತ್ತಿರುವುದರಿಂದ, ಸಿ.ಅ. ಸ್ಟ್ರ್ಯಾನ್ ಯಂತ್ರ ಅನುಷ್ಠಾನಗೊಳಸುವಲ್ಲ ವಿಳಂಭವಾಗುತ್ತಿದೆ. ಸಿವಿಲ್ ಕಾಮಗಾರಿಗಳನ್ನು ಪೂರ್ಣಗೊಳಿಸಿ, ಶೀಫ್ರ, ಸಿ.ಅ. ಸ್ಟ್ರ್ಯಾನ್ ಯಂತ್ರಗಳನ್ನು ಅನುಷ್ಠಾನಗೊಳಸುತ್ತೇವೆ. ಅಲ್ಲದೇ ಅವಶ್ಯವಿರುವ ರೇಡಿಯೋಲಜಸ್ಟ್ ಗಳನ್ನು ನೇಮಿಸಿಕೊಳ್ಳಲು ಕ್ರಮವಹಿಸಲಾಗುವುದು. ಡಾ. ಅಲಕಾನಂದ ಮಳಗಿ, ಡಿಹೆಚ್ಟು.

2. The news item extracted above indicates that Medical Education Department had purchased four C.T. Scan machines by spending a sum of Rs.12 Crores (each costs Rs.3 Crores) and supplied to the



District Hospital, Koppala and Taluk Hospitals of Gangavathi, Yalburga and Kushtagi Taluks. However, even after lapse of one and half months, C.T. Scan machines have not been installed at the hospitals referred to above. On account of the negligence on the part of the concerned in not installing the C.T. Scan machines, the patients are made to visit the private C.T. Scan Centers for getting the C.T. Scan done by spending a huge amount.

3. It is needless to point out that all the District and Taluk Hospitals in the State are established with a view to provide effective and purposeful health care to poorer section of the society who cannot afford to approach private hospitals/private health care practitioners. Any dereliction of duty on the part of the concerned in providing effective and quality health care would not only result in denial of right to life and liberty guaranteed under Article 21 of the Constitution of India, but also

amounts to mal-administration within the meaning of Section 2(10) of the Karnataka Lokayukta Act, 1984. Therefore, the authorities/officers who are entrusted with the responsibility of installing the C.T. Scan machines are required to take immediate steps for installing the C.T. Scan machines and provide effective health care to the poorer sections of the society. In this connection, it is useful to refer to the observations made by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the Case of Paschim Banga Khet Mazdoor Samity & Others V/s State of West Bengal and Another reported in (1996) 4 SCC 37 which reads as hereunder;

9. The Constitution envisages the establishment of a welfare State at the federal level as well as the State level. In a welfare State the primary duty of the Government is to secure the welfare of the people. Providing adequate medical facilities for the people is an essential part of the obligations undertaken by



the Government in a welfare State. The Government discharges this obligation by running hospitals and health centers which provide medical care to avail of those seeking to imposes facilities. Article 21 obligation on the state to safeguard the right to life of every person. Preservation of human life is thus of paramount importance. The government hospitals run by the State and the medical officers employed therein are duty-bound to extend medical assistance for preserving human life. Failure on the part of a government hospital to provide timely medical treatment to a person in need of such treatment results in violation of his right to life guaranteed under Article 21.....

4. In the light of the discussion made above, I am of the view that it is desirable to consider the news item published in 'Samyuktha Karnataka' as

source material to exercise the power conferred on me under Sec. 7(2) and 9(3)(a) of the K.L. Act. Accordingly, I exercise my suo-motu power and the office is directed to register this proceedings as suo-motu proceeding.

5. With a view to examine the issues raised in the news item referred to above, I am of the view, that it is necessary to implead the officers mentioned herein below as parties/respondents to this proceeding and issue notice calling for comments from them.

1.	The District Health Officer, Koppala District, Koppala.
2.	The District Surgeon, District Hospital, Koppala.
3.	The Resident Medical Officer, District Hospital, Koppala.

- 6. The Officers/Officials referred to above are directed to examine the issues raised in the news item extracted above and take immediate steps for installing the C.T. Scan machines at the hospitals referred to above for the benefit of patients forthwith. They are given two weeks time to submit their report/comments i.e., on or before 16.06.2022.
- 7. Communicate the copy of this order to the respondents referred to above along with the copy

of news item published in 'Samyuktha Karnataka Daily' and also the Dy.S.P., Karnataka to Lokayukta, Koppala to investigate the issues referred in the News Item and the officers/officials responsible for making delay in installing the C.T. Scan machines in the hospitals referred to above and submit report on or before 16.06.2022.

8. The respondent no.3 is directed to appear before this authority on 16.06.2022 at 3:30 P.M. for hearing.
